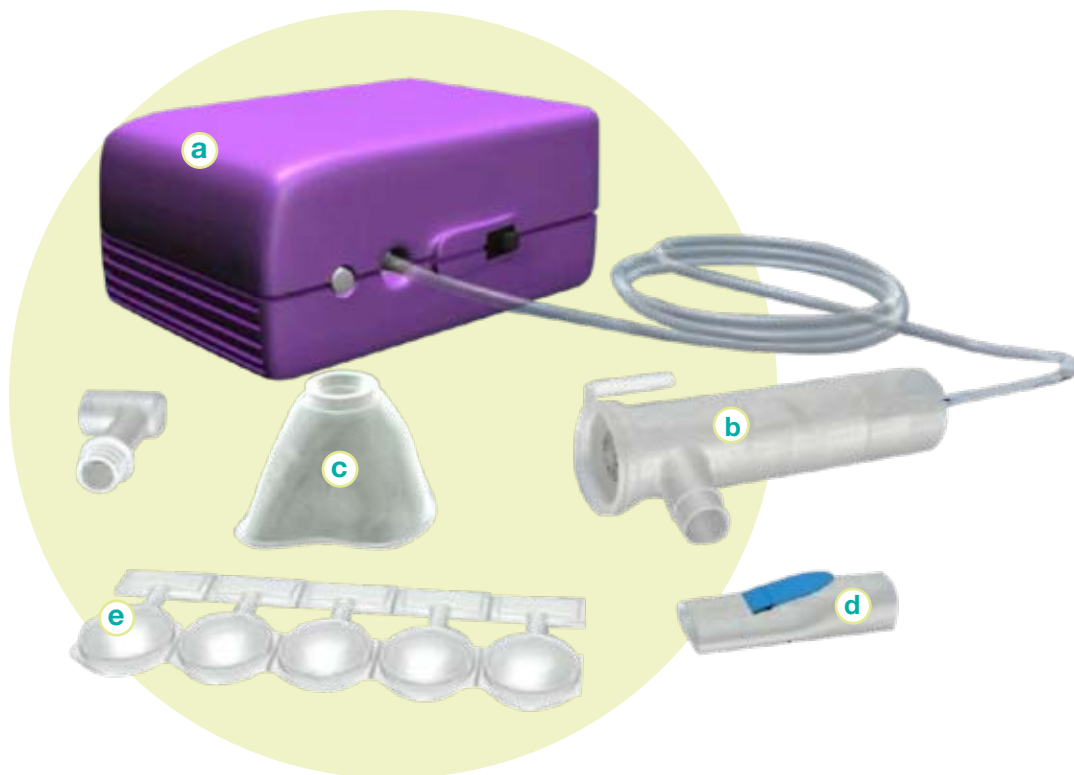
a Compressor

c Mask

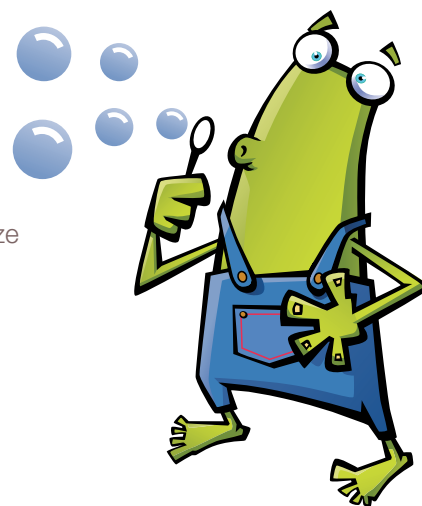
d Mouthpiece

How to use the nebulizer with PULMICORT RESPULES® (budesonide inhalation suspension)

- * Take one ampule out of the sealed aluminum envelope, recording the date you opened the envelope
- * Place any unused ampules back into the envelope and store at room temperature
- * Keep in mind, any remaining ampules should be used within two weeks
- * Gently swirl the ampule using a circular motion, making sure to not squeeze the ampule and keeping it in an upright position
- * Twist off the top of the ampule and squeeze all the liquid into the nebulizer
- * If the child is using a face mask, make sure it fits snugly
- * Turn the compressor on and continue treatment until the mist stops, generally in 5 to 10 minutes



After using the nebulizer with PULMICORT RESPULES® (budesonide inhalation suspension)

Wash the nebulizer so it will be ready for its next use.

If the manufacturer specifies that certain nebulizer parts, such as the nebulizer cup, face mask, or mouthpiece, are dishwasher safe:

- * Place them in a dishwasher-safe basket (such as a baby-bottle-washing basket)
- * Put the basket on the top rack of the dishwasher

If you are hand washing:

- * Wash the jet nebulizer parts (nebulizer cup, face mask, or mouthpiece) with warm water and dish soap
- * Rinse the parts, using warm water, and then shake the excess water out
- * Place the parts on a clean cloth or paper towel to air-dry or hand-dry with a lint-free cloth

Note: Not all nebulizer parts are dishwasher safe.

Nebulizing tips

- * Before attempting to operate it yourself, watch the child use the nebulizer with a parent to become comfortable with the process
- * Familiarize yourself with the child's routine. For example, does the child use the nebulizer at a certain time of day? Does he or she watch a video? Sing a certain song? Engage in a certain activity?
- * Reward the child after using the nebulizer

Important Product and Safety Information you should know

PULMICORT RESPULES is developed and approved specifically for children 12 months to 8 years of age to prevent asthma symptoms and attacks.

PULMICORT RESPULES, an inhaled corticosteroid, is not a quick-relief medication and should NOT be used to treat an acute asthma attack. In studies, side effects were similar to those experienced with placebo. These included respiratory infection, runny nose, coughing, earache, viral infection, stomachache, oral thrush, and nosebleeds. If switching to PULMICORT RESPULES from an oral (syrup or pill) corticosteroid, follow the doctor's instructions to help avoid health risks associated with stopping the use of oral corticosteroids. Tell the doctor if your child is exposed to chicken pox or measles.
